HSDNC ByLaws (page 8) - Article V - Section 7: Absences

A Board member may be removed from office for failure to attend three (3) consecutive unexcused regular meetings in a calendar year as defined by HSDNC Rules. The Board shall adopt rules to define an excused absence. After the second unexcused absence, the Chairperson shall have the Correspondence Secretary or designate send, by Certified mail, a letter to the Board member requesting a written explanation. if the Board member fails to show for the next regular meeting and receives their third unexcused absence, the Chairperson shall have the Recording Secretary or designate place the matter on the agenda for a vote of the Board at the next regular meeting. Though the Board may receive written documentation prior to the meeting, the matter shall not be

discussed among the Board members until the matter is heard at a meeting of the Board pursuant to the Brown Act. A vote of No Confidence by eleven (11) Board members shall be necessary to remove the identified Board member forthwith. The member who is the subject of the removal action will be allowed to speak to the Board, at the meeting and prior to the vote, but shall not take part in the vote. If the vote for removal is affirmative then the position shall be determined to be vacant. If the vote fails and the Board member acquires two (2) additional consecutive unexcused absences the Board member shall automatically be removed from the Board and at that time the position shall be determined to be vacant.

Any meeting of the Council Board, scheduled and noticed as per the Brown Act, shall constitute a meeting for the purpose of determining Board member attendance.

HSDNC ByLaws (page 7) - Article V - Section 6: Vacancies

HSDNC ByLaws (pages 13-14) - Article X - Section 6: Other Election Related Language On the first meeting after the election, the thirteen (13) elected Board members shall review, vote and appoint the remaining seven (7) Neighborhood seats. The election committee will distribute Candidate Filing Forms. Candidate Filing Forms from neighborhood organizations for their two (2) nominated/to be appointed Board Members must be turned in to the committee by the day of the election.

To the extent possible, the Board shall select a Recording Secretary from among the existing Non Officer Board Members by a vote of official action. An Alternate Recording Secretary to the Board may also be selected by the Board to serve in the absence of the primary Recording Secretary. The Recording Secretary and Alternate Recording Secretary serve at the will of the Board.

Then, the Board shall select a Parliamentarian from among the existing Non Officer Board Members by a vote of official action. The Parliamentarian serves at the will of the Board.
